<u>Allied Health Pathway</u> – This pathway is designed for those students who are interested in careers that offer direct patient care. These students have the opportunity, through the Greater Waco Advanced Health Care Academy (GWAHCA), to work alongside medical professionals in local hospitals during their junior and senior years as a nurse's assistants.

In addition to meeting ACCELERATE and MCC requirements, students involved in this pathway must also meet the admission requirements for GWAHCA:

- A negative drug screening
- Clear background check
- Negative TB test
- Current flu shot (due in October)
- Updated Shot Record, with proof of a meningitis vaccination less than 5 years-old
- Proof of Medical Insurance

Students will be required to wear scrubs and white shoes as well as to pay for their Certified Nursing Assistant certification test (\$95.00).
